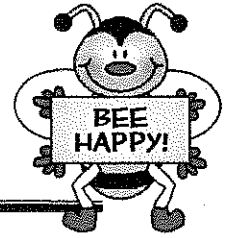
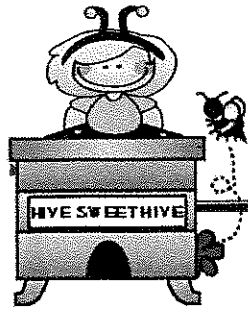

Vocabulary

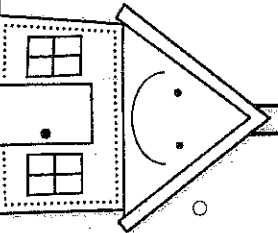
- extinct:** No longer alive. When all of the members of a group are dead.

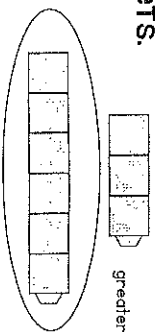
Activities

 - Play with play-doh and have students make imprints of objects in it (fossil).



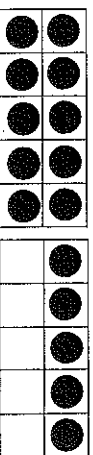
Unit Overview

 This unit is all about comparing and combining sets up to 20. Students will also find the difference between two sets.

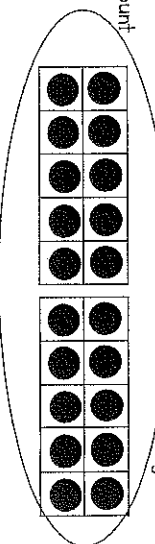


Unit Vocabulary
