- If I Were President: Have your child explain how they would make a difference being the president.



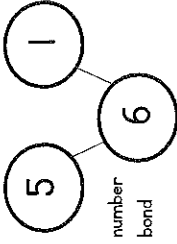
Unit Overview

This unit is all about combining sets and graphing a firm understanding of numbers facts to 10.

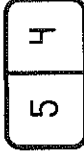


3 and 2 make 5
