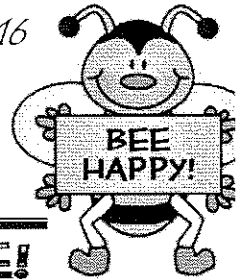
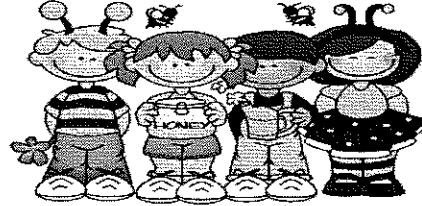

Bats are sleeping.

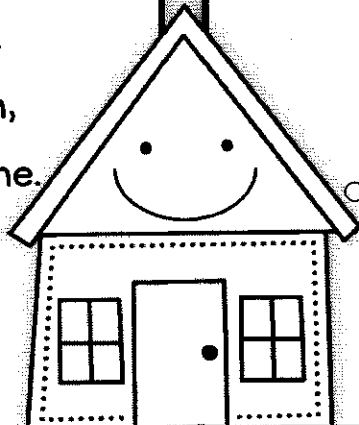
Upside down, upside down.
